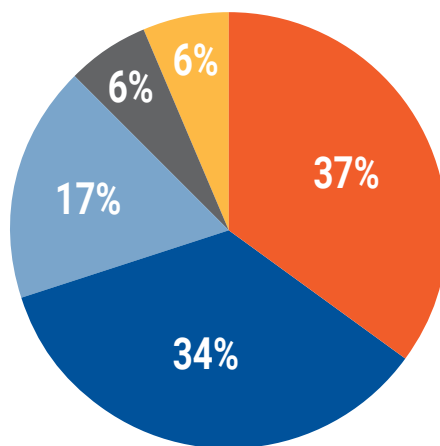
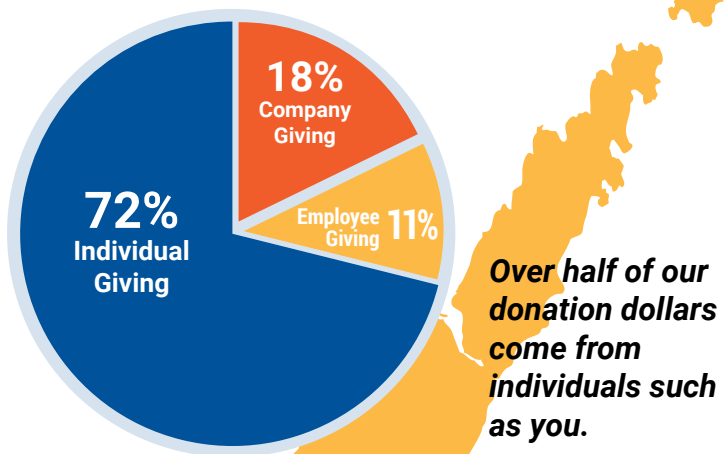

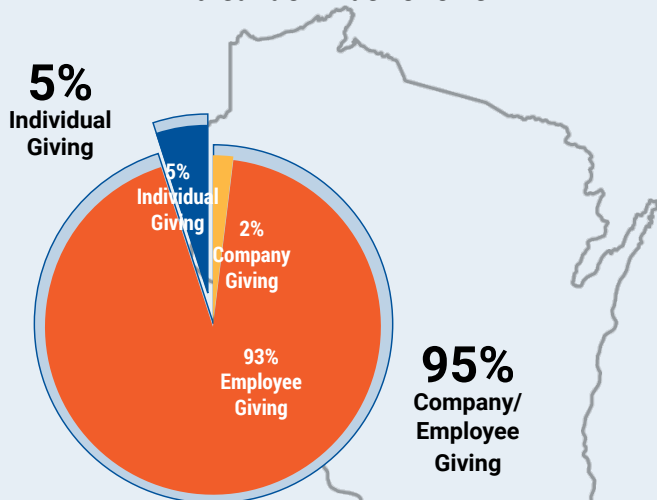
DOOR COUNTY DONORS AT A GLANCE

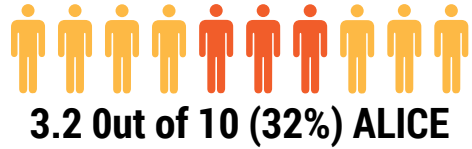

ALICE: Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed

UNDERSTANDING ALICE in Door County



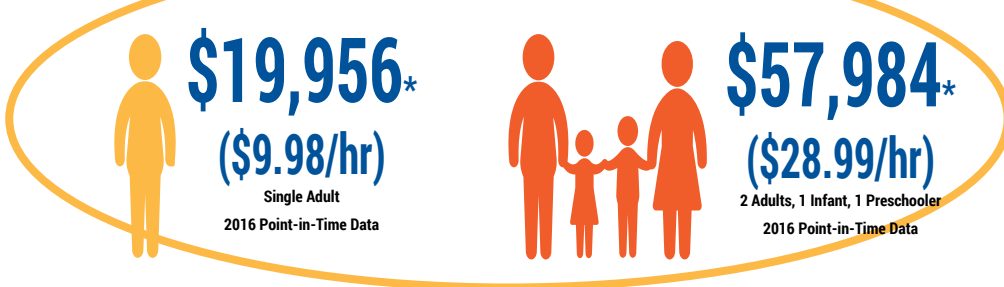
ALICE stands for the population that is Asset Limited, Income Constrained, and Employed – those who are employed but still cannot afford basic necessities – and the effort to measure the ALICE population is a project of the United Way. It is the population that makes too much to officially be in poverty (with income below the poverty line), qualify for government assistance but often make just too little to get by.

It is easy to put a face to ALICE. THEY are hard at work at the grocery store, the day care, the insurance office, the gas station - with a steady but small income – with little or no savings, paying bills (maybe not all the time or on time), and in danger of everything falling apart with one failing car transmission or illness. This is the population that must make choices between medicine and gas to get to work at the end of the month, let alone saving for retirement.

Why are so many households struggling?

The cost of living continues to increase... The Household Survival Budget reflects the bare minimum that a household needs to live and work today. It does not include savings for emergencies or future goals like college. In 2016, costs were well above the Federal Poverty Level of \$11,880 for a single adult and \$24,300 for a family of four. Family costs increased by 18 percent statewide from 2010 to 2016, compared to nine percent inflation nationally.

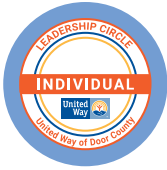
