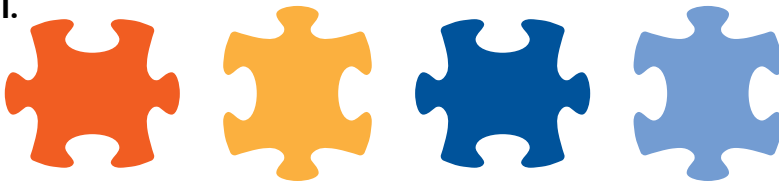
This is our vision for Door County – the place we call home.

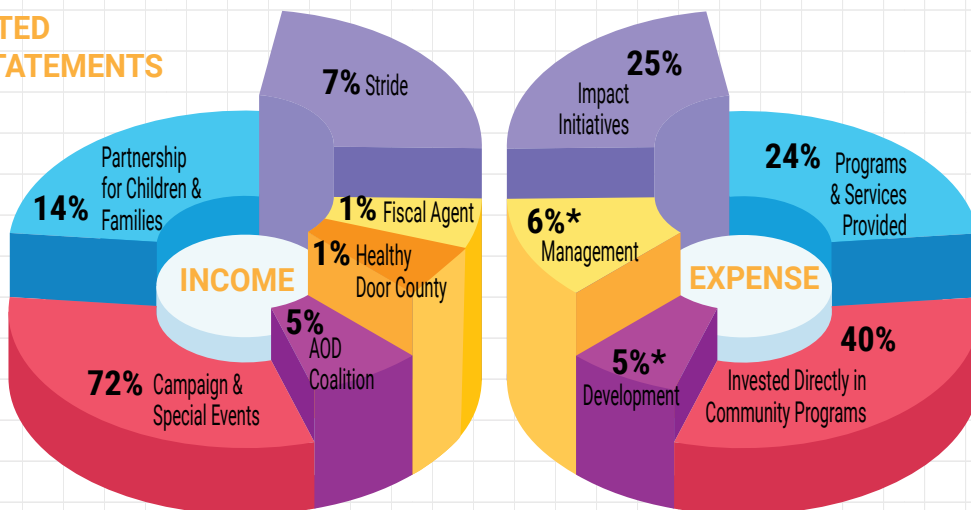

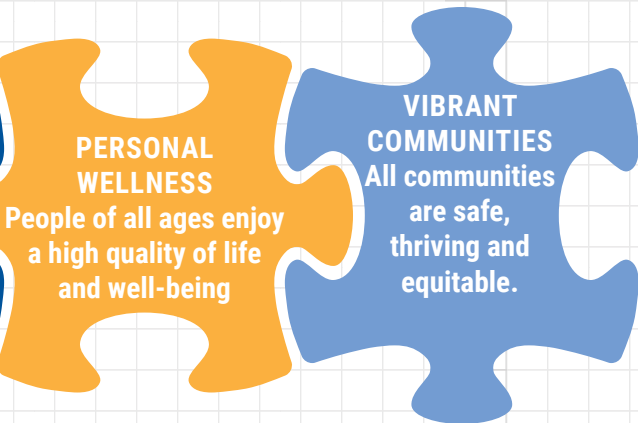
