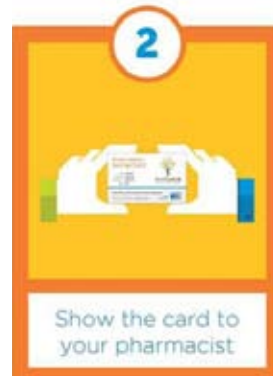

- Food: \$158
- Transportation: \$349
- Health Care: \$214
- Technology: \$55
- Taxes: \$236
- Misc.: \$151

TOTAL - \$1,663

A family of 4

(2 adults, 1 infant, 1 preschooler)
ALICE monthly *survival budget** in Door County looks like this:

- Housing: \$773
- Child Care: \$1,040
- Food: \$525
- Transportation: \$697
- Health Care: \$800
- Technology: \$75
- Taxes: \$523
- Misc.: \$439

TOTAL - \$4,832
